Daniel Boone Home

Lindenwood University's Daniel Boone Home and Boonesfield Village will come alive through Pioneer Days, a pre-1840s folkways festival and living history encampment, on Sept. 20 and 21.

Artisans, music, and a historic encampment will make this a glorious two days in the beautiful Femme Osage Valley just five miles from Defiance. Visitors will step into the past to experience life on the early Missouri frontier and learn

about the Boone legacy.

This event will be fun for the entire family. Children can attend the one-room school or play period games with other visitors. Historical interpreters will create household items from gourds and show how to cook at the hearth of the detached kitchen in the village. An apothecary will explain the benefits of his concoctions while a dulcimer maker and a gunsmith talk about their crafts.

Morgan horses will be working around the village and Colonel Daniel Boone and his biographer, John Filson, will wander the Village sharing their insights and adventures.

Visit for a day or two of music, stories and an immersion of senses in another time.
